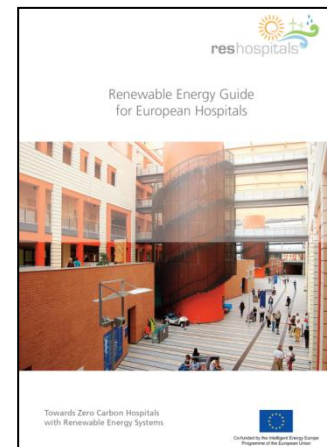
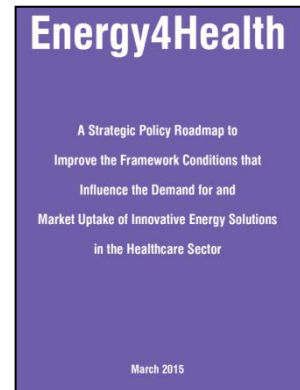

Joint Statement of Demand

A Joint Statement of Demand on Future Energy Solutions for Healthcare has been developed calling for:

- Low carbon, zero emission energy production systems for hospitals
- Zero net cost energy production systems for community healthcare
- Novel energy storage systems for hospitals



Hope to implement via H2020/EE09 project (E4H Districts) aimed at 'engaging and activating public authorities'

1. Excellence

The 'E4H Districts' project (shorthand for Energy-for-Healthcare Districts) is designed to bring the healthcare sector, public authorities and other public/private stakeholders together in a way that will enable them to engage in more strategic options to implement sustainable energy systems for health and social care. It builds on several previous European projects, which have demonstrated the underexploited potential for all parties to collaborate to their mutual benefit and achieve better overall energy outcomes within the district.
